


#### Crude Oil Production ②








## 2022 Record Breaking Oil Production (M bbls)







## Total Employment Growth and Labor Income




- Statewide Job Growth: 23% 14,570+ jobs (2021-2024)
- Statewide Cumulative Labor Income: \$24.1B (2020-2024)






Figure III-2a. – Distribution of Indirect and Induced Activity Generated by Utah's Petroleum Industry: *Employment*, 2020-2024 Average




## Utah GDP - Top Sectors




