Access Rights

Access Rights usually refer to property owners' access from a public road and may include both pedestrian and vehicle access. Property owners need access to and from a public road in order to both utilize and enjoy their property. In addition, access from public roads enhances a parcel's value and utility.

Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU)

An Accessory Dwelling Unit or ADU is a small, self-contained residential unit located on the same lot as an existing single-family home. An ADU has all the basic facilities needed for day-to-day living independent of the main home, such as a kitchen, sleeping area, and a bathroom. As the term "accessory" implies, ADUs are generally defined to be smaller in size and prominence than the main residence on the lot.

Active Transportation

Active Transportation refers to modes of human-powered mobility, such as biking, walking, etc.

Annexation

Annexation is the incorporation of land area into an existing district or municipality, with a resulting change in the boundaries of the annexing jurisdiction.

Appeal Authority

An **appeal authority** means a person, board, commission, agency, or other body designated by ordinance to decide on an appeal of a decision for a land use application, or to a variance to the land use ordinance. When a dispute arises regarding a land use decision, the first appeal of a decision must typically be heard by the local appeal authority.

Association of Governments (AOG)

An **Association of Governments**, often referred to as an **AOG**, refers to a voluntary association of local governments formed under the authority of the <u>Utah Interioral Cooperation Act</u> 20 to provide a common forum to identify, discuss, study, and resolve area or region-wide problems. Information for Utah's seven AOGs can be found the Declaration to the Declaration act.

State of Utah Catastrophic Disaster **Housing Plan**

- Utah spans an impressive area of 84,899 square miles.
 If an individual maintains a moderate walking pace of 3 miles per hour, it will take approximately 14-15 days to traverse from the southern to the northern border of Utah.





Utah Population Estimate

As of January 2022, the estimated population of Utah stands at approximately 3.86 million people. The total population for the specified counties is approximately 3,866,464, with a total of 1,005,105 households.





Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act Public Law

- Title IV Major Disaster Assistance Programs
- Sec. 408. Federal Assistance to Individuals and Households (42 U.S.C. 5174)
- Congress required the FEMA Administrator, in coordination with other Federal agencies, State, local, and tribal governments, and organizations, to develop, coordinate and maintain the National Disaster Housing Strategy, hereinafter referred to as the "Strategy."



Utah Code Title 53 (Public Safety)

- Delineates the authority of the governor to declare a state of emergency and Includes some of the listed:
- Use all available resources of state government as reasonably necessary to cope with a state of emergency;
- Enter into agreement with any agency of the United States for temporary housing units to be occupied by victims of a state of emergency or persons who assist victims of a state of emergency;
- Suspend or modify by executive order, during the state of emergency, any public health, safety, zoning, transportation, or other requirement of a statute or administrative rule within this state if such action is essential to provide temporary housing;

How big of an impact are we thinking?

- The Camp Fire in Paradise, California, in 2018 killed 85 people and forced tens of thousands of others to flee their homes as flames destroyed 18,000 buildings and cause 52,000 people to evacuate.
- If We see an event that destroys 17,938.7 homes with 3.5 people per household, then we need to house = 62,784.45 People.

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FEMA Planning Strategy

Using the State Disaster Housing Strategy as a foundation, the State Disaster Housing Plan is an incident-specific plan that documents the actions that FEMA, the State of Utah, primary, and supporting agencies will take to meet the housing needs of disaster survivors.



Housing Plans are generally 3-5 pages long for most disasters, possibly longer for a larger event. Operational details for the delivery of more complex forms of assistance (such as direct housing or permanent construction) should be addressed in an Implementation Checklist.



Big Utah

Embarking on an ambitious expedition through the diverse landscapes of Utah is a transformative endeavor that spans across 29 counties, encompassing 254 cities, towns, and villages, along with 308 special districts.

 Utah's strategic planning for the future involves a multipronged approach that includes open space and contingent uses, economic impacts, infrastructure rapid conversion, and community recovery.
