

Judy Flores is the Community Planner at Hill Air Force Base located in northern Utah, just south of Ogden. Hill Air Force Base operates much like a small city, complete with housing, schools, medical facilities, stores, and recreational areas. It has its own infrastructure, including roads, utilities, and emergency services. However, unlike a typical city, everything on base is structured around "the mission," meaning that land use, development, and daily operations are carefully planned to enhance military readiness and base-specific objectives. As a Community Planner, Judy is tasked with helping to manage the base's development.

Across Utah, cities and towns are experiencing rapid growth, increased traffic, and shifting community needs. As planners, we have an opportunity to rethink how our streets function-not just as conduits for cars but as places that support economic vitality, social interaction, and safe, multi-modal transportation. The Project for Public Spaces' report, Using Streets to Rebuild Communities, highlights strategies for reclaiming streets as vibrant public spaces.
